We typically admit 5 post-master's students per year, and 3 post-Bachelor's students per year. The post-Bachelor's program takes approximately 5 years to complete, and the post Master's program takes approximately 4 years to complete. This varies across students. Overall, our doctoral students in Counseling Psychology are very timely in their progress through the program.
