#### RECREATION WORKER

Employment of recreational workers is projected to grow 9 percent from 2016 to 2026, about as fast as the average for all occupations.

# MEETING, CONVENTION, AND EVENT PLANNER

Employment of meeting, convention, and event planners is projected to grow 10 percent from 2016 to 2026, faster than the average for all occupations.

## ARCHIVISTS, CURATORS AND MUSEUM WORKERS

Employment of archivists, curators, museum technicians, and conservators is projected to grow 13 percent from 2016 to 2026, faster than the average for all occupations.

## ENTERTAINMENT AND SPORTS OCCUPATIONS

Employment of entertainment and sports occupations is projected to grow 10 percent from 2016 to 2026, faster than the average for all occupations.

### PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Recreation Management prepares students for employment in a variety of settings such as municipal, commercial, and corporate recreation; state and national park services; YMCAs and YWCAs; and armed services recreation. Alumni work in a variety of settings and can emphasize management, campus recreation or outdoor pursuits.
