DESCRIPTION OF MINOR

Minor coursework will provide students with a basic understanding of special education practices, policies and procedures. Students will learn about characteristics of mild to moderate disabilities, assessment, curriculum, instructional strategies, classroom management procedures, assistive technology, and collaborative partnerships between families and education professionals. Qualifying students must be pursuing an undergraduate degree at OSU and must complete 17 hours of special education coursework (SPED).
