## Cleo L. Craig Child Development Laboratory COVID-19 Protocol

The following protocols were developed for all who participate in the learning environment at the CDL.

### Home Visits (Pre-Conference)

Information for Home Visits was sent to families on July 20, 2021.

### Morning drop off between 7:45 – 8:20 am

- Parents/Guardians will send a message on the Brightwheel app to their classroom teacher when they arrive in the parking lot. One parent and the child will enter the building through the west doors. CDL staff will greet you in the foyer to complete a wellness check.
- A CDL staff member will do a wellness check on the child, including child's temperature and looking for skin rash. Hand sanitizer will be applied and a mask will be available before the child proceeds to the classroom.
- Parents will check their child in and out daily using the Brightwheel QR code located in the building foyer.

### Pickup

We want to invite our families to pick up their child in the classrooms.

### Classrooms

- Hand washing will be required upon entering the classroom and routinely throughout the day.
- Hard surfaces will be cleaned with soap and water; then disinfected with a bleach-water solution. Non-washable surfaces will be disinfected using a sprayer with recommended solution. Cleaning and disinfecting will happen a minimum of twice daily.
- Each child will have their temperature retaken after lunch.

### Meals

At this time, each classroom has table dividers available for use. Children will wash hands with soap and water before and after family style meals.

### Staff, Therapists, and Lab Students

All individuals will receive a temperature check before entering the CDL.

### School Calendar

We plan to follow our current school calendar.

### Tuition

In the case of an extreme disruption in services due to an outbreak of COVID-19 or other pandemic-related issues, the Child Development Lab will continue to collect tuition at the monthly rate until the beginning of the third week of disruption. At such time, the COVID-19 funding from a donor may be used to help families until the funds are depleted.

## Positive Test for COVID-19

If someone at the CDL (e.g. student, faculty, or staff member) tests positive for COVID-19, CDL staff and OSU Health Services will determine the appropriate action to take based on the situation. We are required to notify the County Health Dept and Department of Human Services if a child becomes infected with COVID-19 during the school year.

### **When You Can be Around Others After You Had or Likely Had COVID-19** (CDC July 16, 2021)

#### ***I think or know I had COVID-19, and I had symptoms***

You can be around others after:

- 10 days since symptoms first appeared **and**
- 24 hours with no fever without the use of fever-reducing medications **and**
- Other symptoms of COVID-19 are improving\*

*\*Loss of taste and smell may persist for weeks or months after recovery and need not delay the end of isolation.*

Most people do not require testing to decide when they can be around others; however, if your healthcare provider recommends testing, they will let you know when you can resume being around others based on your test results.

Note that these recommendations **do not** apply to persons with severe COVID-19 or with severely weakened immune systems (immunocompromised). These persons should follow the CDC guidance for “I was severely ill with COVID-19 or have a severely weakened immune system (immunocompromised) due to a health condition or medication.”

#### ***I tested positive for COVID-19 but had no symptoms***

If you continue to have no symptoms, you can be with others after 10 days have passed since you had a positive viral test for COVID-19. Most people do not require testing to decide when they can be around others; however, if your healthcare provider recommends testing, they will let you know when you can resume being around others based on your test results.
