How to Enroll

OLLI membership is required to enroll in courses. You must purchase your membership before enrolling in courses.

If you do not have a membership:

1. Visit **OLLI.okstate.edu**
2. Click **Join OLLI**
3. Click **Become a Member**
4. Choose and pay for your membership

6. Click **Enroll in Courses**
7. Use the tools to search for courses
8. Log in using your existing OLLI account information and make your course selection
9. Pay for your courses to complete your registration

COURSE FORMAT OPTIONS

This OLLI session offers you two ways to participate in courses. These options will maximize your opportunities to enjoy the most number of classes.

- **In Person** — This is the traditional class model in which you attend the class in person with an instructor.
- **Online** — Courses are offered through Zoom. Links stay the same for multi-week courses. Recordings are shared with enrollees after the class. Courses are recorded at the discretion of the instructor and may not be shared.

POLICIES

Attendance

Your active participation is important to the success of the classes. If you are enrolled in an online course, please make every attempt to be present on class days. We strive to not have a situation where 20 people enroll but only five show up for the live presentation.

Cancellation Deadlines and Member Credit

Members who cancel their participation in a course or event prior to that activity's cancellation deadline can request credit for any fees paid. This credit can be applied to a future OLLI activity or membership fee upon member request.

Class Size Limits

Courses that are limited in size are noted in the course descriptions. If you are interested in one of these courses, enroll early. Classes must have a minimum of six students enrolled unless otherwise noted.

Course Evaluations

At the end of each course, all members on the roster will receive an email with a link to complete a brief course evaluation. Please complete an evaluation within five days of the end of each course you attend. These evaluations are vitally important to OLLI staff, instructors and the curriculum committee for future course planning.

Dropping a Class and Waitlists

Once a course/activity fills, members are placed on a waitlist in order of enrollment. Members wishing to cancel their participation in an OLLI at OSU activity should contact olli@okstate.edu or 405-744-5868 at least 24 hours in advance of the activity. Staff will then notify the next member on the waitlist.

E-newsletters go out frequently during sessions. These emails tend to include the following information:

Name Tags

If you registered more than a week before in-person classes begin, you will have a name tag at the registration table. If you register less than a week prior to the first class meeting date, your name tag will be available the second meeting date. Alert the site coordinator if your nametag needs to be replaced. You are responsible for wearing your nametag whenever you are at an OLLI event or class.

Payment and Refunds

All fees are due at the time of registration. A 100% refund of class fees will be granted if canceled within seven days of the class start date. We accept payment by check and Visa/MasterCard/Discover credit cards. Only OSU employees may accept payments. The staff who work for our satellite classroom partners cannot accept payments for OLLI at OSU memberships or activities. No refunds are available after classes begin. OLLI at OSU staff make every attempt to reschedule activities that cannot be held at their originally scheduled date and time. If a class cannot be rescheduled, any course fees paid will be refunded or credited to your account.

Public Health and Safety

OLLI at OSU staff follow the health and safety policies put forth by the university. If you are feeling ill, please stay home to keep yourself and fellow OLLI members safe.

Light snacks, coffee and water are included with registration for in-person classes.

Otherwise, the decision to cancel an activity during inclement weather will be made based on conditions at each classroom location and input from our instructors. In the event that an OLLI at OSU activity is canceled or rescheduled for any reason, members will be notified by email or text message. It is important that you provide OLLI at OSU with your best contact information. If your phone accepts text messages, please ensure we have your mobile carrier on file.

Visit a Multicultural Gem: Shawnee Daytrip

Friday, TBA

Join in as we check out Shawnee, the birthplace of celebrity Brad Pitt and home to more than 30 painted pony statues. Our stops include Citizen Potawatomi Nation's Cultural Heritage Center's newly renovated galleries that feature tribal history from pre-contact to present day, including the Potawatomi gift shop with authentic, locally made Native American gifts. We'll visit the Mabee-Gerrer Museum of Art, Oklahoma's oldest art museum. Founded in 1919, it is home to one of the nation's largest collections of Egyptian art and artifacts. We'll stop by the Pottawatomie County Museum with its eclectic collection of local artifacts. Another stop is the Eagle Aviary run by the Potawatomi Nation and the first of its kind to incorporate culturally significant elements into the rescue facility's design. Lunch will be at the family owned Paul's Place Steakhouse, where the locals eat, so you know it'll be good.

Alaska's Northern Lights

March 24-30, 2025, 7 days

Travel from Anchorage, a city on the edge of the snow capped Chugach Mountains and 60 sparkling glaciers, to Fairbanks, one of the best places in Alaska to see the Northern Lights. Lodging is in Anchorage (2 nights) and Fairbanks (3 nights) with one night at the iconic Talkeetna Alaskan Lodge, perched on a ridge offering unforgettable views of Denali and the Alaskan Range

Highlights include a daytime glacier cruise of Prince William Sound, narrated by an expert guide, where blue skies collide with stark white glaciers and playful otters dip in and out of the calm water. A daylong journey on the Aurora Winter Train through snow-covered mountains and striking valleys, with dinner included in the dining car. A visit to a musher's home and kennel, where you can try your hand at dog mushing on a sled with an expert guide and dinner at the kennel owner's home to learn more about the life of a musher.

Other stops include the Musk Ox Farm; Antique Auto Museum, where vintage cars sit between timely artifacts and fashionable designer dresses; and the Museum of the North, the University of Alaska's collection featuring 2.2 million years of biodiversity and thousands of years of human history.

Spotlight on Tuscany

Rolling landscapes, savory wines, delicious food and stunning architecture. Unpack once on this journey among Italy's most charming towns and stay in the heart of Tuscany in the famous spa resort town of Montecatini Terme, known for its healing waters since before the time of the Romans.

Highlights include Lucca, filled with Renaissance walls, Romanesque churches and medieval streets flanked by towers. The Devil's Bridge in Borgo a Mozzano and the remains of the Gothic Line—the German's last defense during WWII. Florence, the beautiful Cradle of the Renaissance, with a local guide strolling medieval streets flanked by Renaissance walls, Romanesque churches and towers, where works by Michelangelo and Donatello lounge. Historic sites in the ancient maritime Republic of Pisa, including that famous leaning tower and the Field of Miracles. The hilltop village of San Gimignano, an enchanting medieval town famous for its 14 towers and views overlooking vineyards.

The food highlights include visiting the quaint countryside to learn the secrets of this area's traditional cuisine. A cooking class, using local ingredients and culinary techniques that have been passed down for generations. A cheese farm to learn how the famous pecorino cheese is made before sampling it. A Tuscan feast of traditional cuisine and wines set in the countryside. A winery to learn about the art of winemaking and taste local varieties.

European Christmas Markets

A grand holiday adventure through the winter wonderland of the Imperial Cities of Central Europe—Prague, Vienna and Budapest. Along the way, immerse yourself in festive Christmas markets, enjoy traditional entertainment, sample local cuisine, and glimpse this region's rich history.

Highlights include the famous Christmas market in Prague's Old Town Square, where wooden huts are filled with the work of local artisans, and traditional food and drink are prepared right in front of you. The world's oldest Christmas market in Dresden, Germany—the Striezelmarkt—which has been delighting travelers and locals alike since 1434, where stalls overflow with ornaments and treats. A candy workshop in Vienna where sweets are still being made according to traditional recipes dating back over 150 years. The Christkindlmarkt at Vienna's neo-gothic Rathaus City Hall, the biggest and most famous market in the city.

Train ride to Bratislava, Slovakia, the former Imperial capital of the Habsburg Empire and city with a 4,000-year history and charming Christmas markets. Learn to make traditional strudel before enjoying a typical Hungarian dinner at a rustic local restaurant preserving 200 years of cultural and architectural traditions. Christmas markets in Budapest—the cozy market at St. Stephen's Basilica or the city's largest at Vörösmarty Square brimming with food and crafts stalls where local musicians often perform.



SPECIAL PROGRAM

The Cognitive Stimulation Program: Train Your Brain

These courses are the creation of Dr. Sabiha Parveen and her team in OSU's Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders. This eight-week program will include group-based activities aimed to improve and maintain some of the critical cognitive skills (including attention, memory and social communication) for increased safety, independence and engagement in daily activities. Groups are available for anyone who is interested in learning ways to keep their brain engaged and active.

Three options are available:

- Online group for those beginning to notice some changes in attention and memory but not seeing an impact in daily interactions and performances.*
- Online group for those who have been seeing considerable changes in attention and memory and also seeing impact in ability to do things they enjoy.*
- In-person group that will target skills such as attention, memory, naming and problem-solving.
