

Resilience in Osteoarthritis

Online Research

The Cognitive Science Laboratory at OSU is is looking for volunteers for a research study. The purpose of this research is to investigate resilience among adults living with osteoarthritis. Specifically, researchers would like to identity factors that are associated with greater resilience.

You must be at least 18 years of age, have osteoarthritis and live in the United States to be eligible for the study. The study is 100% online. The survey includes questions about your experiences with osteoarthritis, personal characteristics including your personality, life experiences, and demographic information. In addition to answering questions about these topics, you will also be asked to write a brief description of how osteoarthritis has affected your life. The survey is designed to be completed on a computer rather than a cell phone, and it is likely to take around 40 minutes. For more information or to participate, click here.
