Hi. Friends!



# The Transcendence of Watercolors: A Demonstration with Fatemeh Kian *Friday, Nov. 6, 3:00 - 4:30 pm*

We are thrilled that our friend, Fatemeh Kian, will demonstrate how she creates a landscape similar to her painting in the above illustration. A lifelong artist and an art educator by career, Fatemeh shares her insight and techniques with people of all ages. She holds a Master of Calligraphy degree--the highest in the field--from the Iranian Association of Calligraphers, and, though her calligraphy is stunning, her passion is watercolor painting. In 2015 she left her home in Tehran for Stillwater, where she continued teaching, this time as a volunteer for OLLI@OSU. In 2017 she moved to Los Angeles to be near family, but she says her heart is still in Oklahoma with the friends she made here. Watching Fatemeh create one of her masterpieces is a relaxing, meditative experience. Her calming nature shows in her paintings. If you enjoy watercolors, this lesson will help you improve your skills. And if you don't paint, you may find yourself wondering why not. We're certain everyone will enjoy this lecture. # *Under Her Wing Was the Universe*: An Artist Talk with romy owens *Friday, Nov. 6, 3:00 - 4:30 pm*

romy owens is the creator of a universe with a prairie, a pavilion and a thousand stars. The multi-purpose, public art installation is a soaring piece of community art in Enid. What does it take to bring a project from its inception more than three years ago to the ribbon cutting this past July, to create community involvement and and see it to completion? romy will tell you what it takes. She'll also talk about the concepts that inspired her to take on such a monumental task.

romy owens is an artist and curator who lives in Enid. She makes site-specific installations, as well as smaller objects, in reaction to place, community and transformation. Her curatorial work attends to a similar focus. Both her artistic and curatorial practices are presently centered around community art designed to impact social change, using art as a method to broaden our understanding of specific issues. You can stand with scientists on Arctic ice, flying above the ice sheet, glaciers and sea ice as part of Operation IceBridge, and then head to Hawaii as scientists with NASA's CORAL mission dive into Kaneohe Bay. Warning: Please sit down while you interact with this video. 360-degree videos allow you to change the view to see in all directions by moving your desktop cursor or by moving your mobile device. Yes, it's incredible! But beware that some people may experience dizziness from the 360-degree virtual movement. Falling over would distract you from an otherwise pleasant experience.
