### **Major Artists of Gilcrease Museum**

**3/9 Rod Schneider** has been involved with the Gillies for over 15 years and held many positions of leadership including serving as the president. He has a BA from San Diego State and an MSA from Georgia College. Rod is a retired USAF pilot and is retired from Williams Company Aviation. His topic will be *Alfred Jacob Miller*.

### Voices from the University: OSU's Cutting Edge

**3/9 Jim Ansley,** Professor and Head of the Dept. of Natural Resource Ecology and Management, OSU-Stillwater. The department includes faculty with expertise in wildlife, forestry, rangeland and fisheries. Dr. Ansley heads the OSU connection to the South Central Climate Adaptation Science Center, administered at OU. His presentation will be *Galapagos, Peas & Plates: A Convergence of Ideas*.

### The Best & Brightest: Oklahoma Authors

**3/12 Laura Arata** is Assistant Professor of History and Director of Public History at OSU. Her research specializations include race and gender in the American West, popular and material culture, historic preservation and oral history. Her works have appeared in *Montana: The Magazine of Western History*, the *Pacific Northwest Quarterly*, and elsewhere. She discovered Sarah Bickford's story while attending a Public History Field School in Virginia City. Topic: Her book, *Race and the Wild West: Sarah Bickford*, the *Montana Vigilantes*, and the *Tourism of Decline*, 1870- 1930
