# **Chronic Pain Study**

Colorado State University's Departments of Occupational Therapy and Human Development and Family Studies are conducting an online research study for pairs of people with chronic pain. The goals are to help with their pain and discover how pain affects their daily lives. They are looking for pairs of connected people (spouses, partners, parent/adult child, and friends/neighbors) who have chronic pain and who help each other. Participants must be 18 years of age or older, must have a willing partner (caregiver or care receiver), and must have chronic or persistent pain. The 8-week study includes:

- Gentle movement and education for people with pain
- Up to \$100 in gift cards
- Free sessions led by professionals
- Online sessions for convenience and safety
