Admissions Criteria

Opportunity Orange Scholars is an individualized two-year, residential, non-degree certificate program at Oklahoma State University for students with a primary or secondary diagnosis of intellectual disability. We accept students between the ages of 18 and 26. Transfer credits from other colleges or postsecondary programs do not apply.

Applicants must meet all of the following requirements to apply for Opportunity Orange Scholars:

- Are 18 to 26 years of age by the first day of the fall semester of admission.
- Have a diagnosis of intellectual disability and do not meet the criteria as a degree-seeking student.*
- Personal desire to gain necessary skills for self-determination, interdependent living, community engagement, and employment.
- Ability to identify basic support needs.
- Self-manage daily activities including medication. **

**IMPORTANT NOTE: Opportunity Orange Scholars does not provide 24/7 supervision for students. Parents and Applicants must trust scholars can make safe decisions without 24/7 supervision and structured programming on evenings and weekends. The safety of our students drives every decision made by our staff. A student may be dismissed from the program if, in the professional opinion of our staff, the student is displaying behavior that could endanger themselves or someone else.

^{*} The program adheres to the American Association on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (AAIDD) definition of intellectual disability as "a disability characterized by significant limitations both in intellectual functioning and in adaptive behavior as expressed in conceptual, social, and practical adaptive skills. This disability originates before the age of 22." Evidence of significant limitations in intellectual and cognitive functioning and adaptive behavior must be provided in the form of a psychoeducational evaluation, the most recent Individualized Education Plan (IEP), and/or a formal letter from a licensed professional with expertise in intellectual disability assessment.

If you do NOT meet the above criteria AND if you have a high school diploma with at least a 3.0 GPA and/or an ACT score of 21 or better, admission as a degree-seeking student at Oklahoma State University may be a better option for you.

Application Process

How to Apply

- Applicants must apply for admission through the <u>Opportunity</u>
 <u>Orange Scholars</u> website. Students do not complete a
 traditional OSU admissions application.
- Completed application and all requested materials must be submitted by November 15th to be considered for Fall 2025 admissions.
- Incomplete application packets will not be considered.
- Applicants will receive an automated email confirmation of receipt of their application.

Current application materials are only valid for the current application period (2025 - 2026). Applicants who are not accepted for the current academic period will be required to submit a <u>new</u> application each year should they decide to reapply in the future.

- Social/character recommendation: Someone who can speak to your character, social skills, and ability to manage behaviors (e.g., coach, clergy, coworker, etc.).
- **A recommendation form will be sent to each reference via email. Applications are not considered complete until we have received all three online recommendation forms. It is YOUR responsibility to ensure your references have received and submitted their forms before the due date. We do NOT accept written letters of recommendation/support in place of required recommendation forms.

Letter(s) of Guardianship, if applicable (for example: court order for appointment guardian, letters of guardianship, etc.) - If applicants are their own guardian, no paperwork is required.

Application Timeline - What to Expect

- All applications (including supporting documents and recommendation forms) are due November 15th.
- Review of complete applications begins the last week of November.
- Select candidates are invited to an interview with the Opportunity Orange Scholars admissions committee in early January 2025.
- Students will be notified by February 2025 about admission to the program.
 - o Five to eight students will be admitted to begin study in the Fall 2025 semester.
 - o Acceptance and admission into Opportunity Orange Scholars is selective. Meeting basic admission criteria does not guarantee acceptance into the program.
- Accepted Scholars will be required to attend orientation inperson Summer 2025. Detailed Complete orientation information will be provided upon acceptance.
- First day of fall semester: August 18, 2025.
