- Maintain a 2.50 Overall Cumulative Retention GPA (includes all undergraduate and graduate coursework for grad students)
ACT (with writing) minimum of 22 required OR SAT with minimum score of 1120 and writing section scores of 5 for Reading, 4 for Analysis, and 5 for Writing OR a minimum General Education GPA of 2.75 in 30 hours or more across general education courses OR Pass the PRAXIS Core Academic Skills for Educators Test OR hold a Bachelor's degree.
"C" or better in a Foundations of Education Course (HDFS 3603) AND a Field Experience course (HDFS 3623)
Grade of "C" or better in CIED 4133 Introduction to K-12 English Language Learners OR Pass the Intro to K-12 English Learners micro credential course OR Demonstrate competency in a foreign language (2 years of HS in the same language with grades of "B" or better, or 3 college hours with a grade of "C" or better)
Pass the Trauma Informed Practices and Legal Issues in Education training with a 100% (completed during student teaching semester)
Pass the Certification Exams for Oklahoma Educators:
