SCFD prospective students Q & As:

- 1. I live in another state, can I pursue the program completely online?
 - Probably not. While many courses may be taken online, the Social Foundations of Education Ph.D. program is not designed to be an exclusively online program. Course completion will likely require some in-person course attendance.
- 2. Can I take all classes on Tulsa campus?
 - Probably not. Many social foundations courses are offered at OSU's Tulsa campus, but other courses may require attendance at the main campus in Stillwater or attendance online.
- 3. Can I get financial assistantship?
 - Perhaps. A limited number of graduate assistantships are available. Please note your desire for financial consideration in your application package. Also, visit OSU's financial aid website for other funding opportunities.
- 4. Are there teaching opportunities?
 - Yes. A limited number of Graduate Teaching Assistantships are available to teach undergraduate courses.
- 5. Is there opportunity to work with faculty members on research projects?
 - Yes. A limited number of Graduate Research Assistantships are available. Generally, however, most students work on their own independent research projects with faculty guidance.
- 6. What kind of career paths do your graduates take?
 - Program graduates include K-16 educators and administrators, community activists, educational leaders, policy makers, and analysts.
- 7. Are evening, weekend, and summer courses offered?
 - Yes. To accommodate working professionals, most Social Foundations courses begin in the late afternoon/early evening. Select courses are also offered each summer. Weekend courses may be available during some semesters as well.
- 8. How long does it take to complete the program?
 - Determined full-time students can complete the program in 3.5--4-years. For part-time students, 6-8 years may be more realistic. All program work must be completed within a ten-year window.
