Aerospace Security will prepare you for a career as a licensed aviation inspector or a security manager, conducting safety assessments, designing security systems and overseeing security operations for governmental agencies or private aerospace organizations. Develop a broad knowledge of security issues through courses related to airport network security, aviation terrorism and asymmetrical warfare, aircraft accident investigation, security countermeasures and aviation security law, among other topics.
