OVERVIEW

Build upon your current registered nurse (RN) license by earning a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) through OSU's RN to BSN program. This program is only available to transfer students who have either earned an associate degree or have a diploma in nursing from an accredited nursing program. Your nursing knowledge will be enriched with a broader perspective of both the nursing profession and the dynamic healthcare environment. Graduates are prepared for leadership roles in acute, chronic or community health care settings, such as hospitals, long-term care facilities, armed services and Veteran's hospitals, home health services, research centers, correctional facilities, K-12 educational institutions and more.

1. Complete the OSU undergraduate application for admission at okstate.edu/apply as a transfer student and pay the application fee.
2. Submit up-to-date original transcripts from all current and prior academic institutions attended to admissions@okstate.edu.
3. Submit a copy of your current, unrestricted RN license to admissions@okstate.edu.
4. Await notification of your admission decisions from OSU and from the Nursing: RN to BSN Program.
5. Connect with OSU's nursing advisor to plan your first semester enrollment.
