Pursue your passion for addressing the educational, social and developmental needs of young children by pursuing the Early Childhood Education degree option. This program integrates teaching techniques that will help you improve the intellectual and emotional development of children in public schools, private schools and community programs. Through four field experiences you will participate in hands-on learning that links educational theory and research with daily teaching practice. Graduates are recommended to the State of Oklahoma for certification to teach pre-kindergarten through third grade and are prepared for certification exams in other states. Many states offer reciprocal teaching certification.
