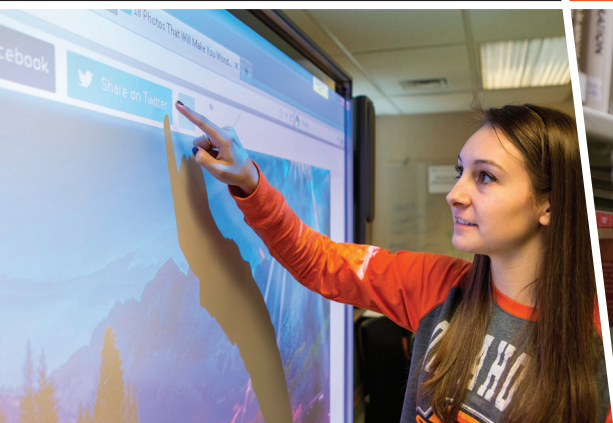

OVERVIEW

Impact students' lives by teaching English and/or language arts in grades 6-12 through the Secondary Education: English degree option. You will complete 48 credit hours of in-depth study of literature, composition and grammar in addition to training in developmental psychology, learning theory and teaching methods. As a Secondary Education graduate, you will also enter the classroom with extensive, and relevant practical experience from multiple field experiences. Upon degree completion, all graduates are recommended to the State of Oklahoma for full certification to teach and are prepared for certification exams in other states, if preferred. Many states offer reciprocal teaching certification.
