Focus on helping children, families and vulnerable populations navigate family dynamics and social well-being with a degree option in Child and Family Services. Study people, their relationships and their impact on the world and prepare for career opportunities that encompass intervention, prevention and regulatory services. The program offers psychological theory and undergraduate research opportunities. With several degree specializations and 21 credits of customizable coursework, you can choose a personalized professional path leading to a career with non-profits, community organizations, family life education groups, child protective services, skilled nursing or assisted living facilities and child care programs. You can also use your study of people and relationships as a strong foundation for graduate and professional study in medicine, allied healthcare, law, counseling, research and social work.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Integrated internship experience empowers application of classroom knowledge to the “real-world” helping profession of your choice.
- 21 credits of customizable coursework provides flexibility to personalize the degree with prerequisites for pre-professional tracks to law, medicine and allied healthcare programs.
- 3+3 early admission to law school option allows completion of bachelor’s and a law degree in six years.
- Service-learning project allows you to advocate for individuals with developmental disabilities.
