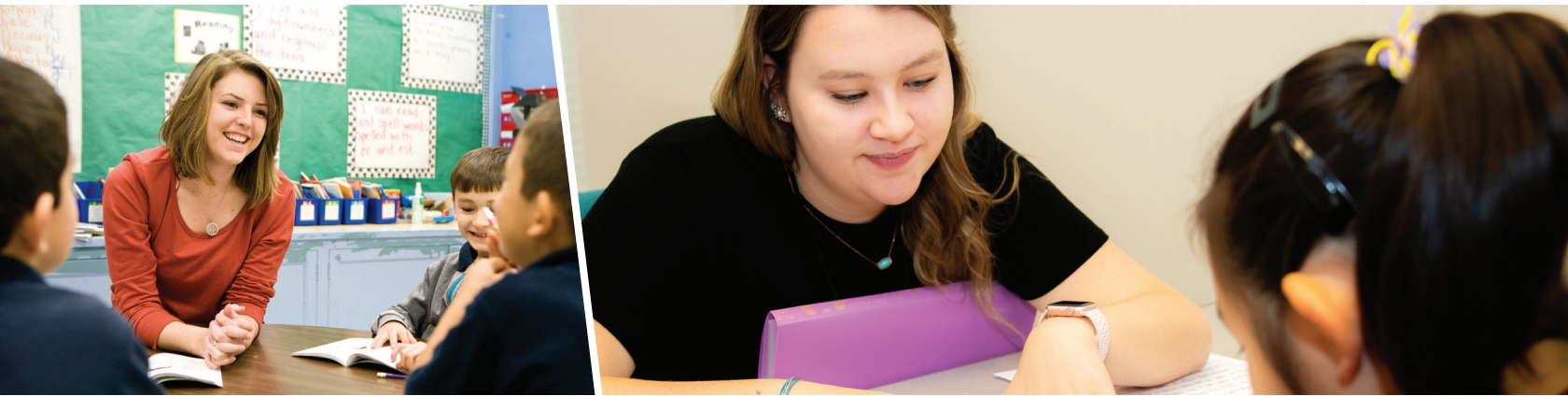

OVERVIEW

Prepare to stimulate life-long learning and enrich the quality of life for students in first through eighth grade by majoring in Elementary Education. Through your courses and nearly 1,000 hours of field experience, you will be equipped to positively affect the educational outcomes of your future students, and you will be recognized for your in-depth knowledge of instructional methods, including teaching with technology. Upon program completion, all graduates are recommended to the State of Oklahoma for full certification to teach and are prepared for certification exams in other states. Many states offer reciprocal teaching certification.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Committed to preparing graduates to teach with technology, including support for pursuing Apple Teacher and Google Educator certifications.
- Recognized within the education community for producing graduates who have in-depth knowledge of instructional methods.
- Three distinct opportunities to teach and observe diverse classrooms in both rural and urban environments, for a minimum of 146 hours of field experience before the senior clinical practice internship.
- Opportunity to participate in the ExCEL Program, an intensive, full-year field experience in Stillwater Public Schools.
- Possibility of international placement for student teaching in Mexico and Costa Rica.
