Program Description

The Aviation and Space Program prepares students for careers in the aerospace industry. The Bachelor of Science in Aerospace Administration and Operations, Professional Pilot option prepares students for careers in flight operations in both the general aviation and the air carrier segments of the aviation industry. In addition to high quality aviation related coursework, the student will attain FAA certifications for Private Pilot, Commercial Pilot-Instrument Rated for both single-engine and multi-engine aircraft and Certified Flight Instructor. The Professional Pilot option is compliant with Title 14 CFR of the Code of Federal Regulations Part 141 and accredited by Aviation Accreditation Board International (AABI).

The Aerospace Administration and Operations program has been authorized by the FAA to issue the Restricted Airline Transport Pilot (R-ATP) certificate.

The OSU Flight Center at the Stillwater Regional Airport houses our fleet of 25 aircraft consisting of Cessna 152s, Cessna 172s, Cessna 182RGs, Piper PA-44s, Beechcraft C-90B as well as a Redbird MCX Simulator.

Job Description

Commercial Pilots

Pilot and navigate the flight of fixed-winged aircraft on nonscheduled air carrier routes, or helicopters. Requires Commercial Pilot certificate. Includes charter pilots with similar certification, and air ambulance and air tour pilots.

Airline Pilots, Copilots, and Flight Engineers

Pilot and navigate the flight of fixed-wing, multi-engine aircraft, usually on scheduled air carrier routes, for the transport of passengers and cargo. Requires Federal Air Transport Pilot certificate and rating for specific aircraft type used. Includes regional, national, and international airline pilots and flight instructors of airline pilots.
